### STIPULATED SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This Agreement and Order is entered into by and between Plaintiffs The Wilderness Society, Quiet Use Coalition, WildEarth Guardians, Rocky Mountain Wild, and Great Old Broads for Wilderness (hereafter "Plaintiffs") and Defendants the United States Forest Service, and Jerri Marr in her official capacity as Forest Supervisor for the Pike San Isabel National Forest (hereafter "Forest Service") (together, the "Parties");

WHEREAS, in 2009 the Forest Service issued Motor Vehicle Use Maps ("MVUMs") reflecting the designation of a system of routes available for public motorized use for the Pike and San Isabel National Forests (the "PSI");

WHEREAS Plaintiffs contend that the Forest Service violated the National Environmental Policy Act ("NEPA") by designating routes as open for public motorized use without analyzing those routes pursuant to NEPA;

WHEREAS Plaintiffs contend that the Forest Service violated the Endangered Species Act ("ESA") by designating routes within the critical habitat for the Mexican spotted owl and Preble's meadow jumping mouse without consulting with the United States Fish and Wildlife Service;

WHEREAS Plaintiffs contend that the Forest Service violated the National Forest Management Act ("NFMA") by failing to ensure that all routes reflected on the MVUMs are consistent with the Forest Plan for the PSI;

WHEREAS Plaintiffs contend that the Forest Service violated 36 C.F.R. § 212.55(b) by issuing the MVUMs, and technical corrections thereto, without applying the minimization criteria under the regulation and 36 C.F.R. § 212.52(a) by including routes on the MVUM without public involvement;

WHEREAS, although the Forest Service does not admit any of the allegations or claims set forth in Plaintiffs' Complaint, and whereas Plaintiffs do not concede that Defendants' implementation of the terms of this Agreement satisfies the legal requirements alleged in its underlying claims for relief in this case, the Parties, through their authorized representatives, have reached a settlement that they believe is in the public interest and consider to be a just, fair, adequate, and equitable resolution of the disputes set forth in Plaintiffs' Complaint;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS STIPULATED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Forest Service will undertake motorized travel management planning to designate roads, trails and areas open to public motorized vehicle use on the six districts of the Pike and San Isabel National Forests pursuant to 36 C.F.R. Part 212, Subpart B which

implements Executive Order 11644, as amended by Executive Order 11989, in compliance with all applicable federal statutes and regulations, including NEPA, ESA and NFMA. The Forest Service will provide an explanation in its NEPA analysis (or analyses) of how it considered the criteria set forth in 36 C.F.R. § 212.55(a) in designating roads, trails and areas and considered, with the objective of minimizing, the criteria set forth in 36 C.F.R. § 212.55(b) in designating trails and areas.

a. In completing an analysis (or analyses) pursuant to NEPA for travel management route designation referenced in Paragraph 1, the Forest Service will include within the statement regarding the purpose and need of the analysis (or analyses): (1) the intent for the PSI's designated transportation system to comply with all applicable laws; (2) the need to consider effects on resources with the objective of minimizing the impacts resulting from the designated motorized trails and areas pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 212.55(b); and (3) the need to ensure that routes, including those in the baseline contested by Plaintiffs in this litigation and those proposed for designation, are properly analyzed for environmental impacts. For the purposes of travel management route designation described in this Agreement, the Parties agree that the routes or route segments listed in the letter dated January 7, 2011 from Melanie Kay to Jerri Marr, attached hereto as Exhibit A, are the routes contested by Plaintiffs.

b. In preparing an analysis (or analyses) pursuant to NEPA for travel management route designation referenced in this Paragraph 1, the Forest Service shall analyze a no-action alternative using only the route system depicted on the PSI's most recently published MVUMs prior to this Agreement to represent the baseline system of roads and trails, excluding the routes designated for interim closure pursuant to Paragraph 2 below. In utilizing the most recent MVUMs as the no-action alternative, the Forest Service will acknowledge that while the MVUMs represent the physical baseline against which alternative designations will be compared, the legal status of many of the routes on the MVUMs is contested. Maps and/or other

depictions of the baseline system of roads and trails in the no-action alternative will include a visual indication of the routes or route segments listed in Exhibit A.

c. In preparing the analysis (or analyses) pursuant to this Paragraph 1, the Forest Service will consider a range of reasonable alternative actions that would result in varying numbers and spatial allocations of routes designated for motorized vehicle use. The Forest Service agrees that it will analyze an alternative that does not include in the proposed action any of the routes or route segments listed in Exhibit A.

d. The Parties agree that the commitment in Paragraph 1.c. above does not limit the Forest Service's discretion to consider and adopt any alternative as a result of the NEPA process for the travel management route designations.

e. For the NEPA analysis (or analyses) described in Paragraph 1, the Forest Service will complete the Subpart B planning process(es), issue a/all final NEPA analysis (or analyses), the draft decision(s), and notice of the objection period, pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 218, no later than 5 years after the entry of this Agreement and Order. A final decision (or final decisions) will be issued upon completion of the objection process. If the Forest Service anticipates that it will be unable to meet the 5 year deadline set out in this Paragraph, the Forest Service will confer with the Plaintiffs regarding the estimated time for completing the actions specified in this first sentence of this Paragraph and reserves the right to seek to modify the Agreement to extend time for completion of the actions specified in this first sentence of this Paragraph 8 below. Plaintiffs reserve the right to oppose any such extension.

2. Prior to issuance of the travel management route designation decision(s) identified in Paragraph 1, the Forest Service agrees to take the actions identified below. As used in this paragraph, the terms "closure," "closures," "closed," or "close" means removal of the route from the MVUM, removal of any signage that exists on the ground indicating or suggesting that the

route is open to motorized use, initially placing closure signage at the point where the closed route intersects a route open to public motor vehicle travel, and posting of the closure in accordance with 36 C.F.R. § 261.51. The Forest Service will, in its sole discretion, take any additional measures it deems necessary to enforce the closures, including physical closures, on-the-ground public contacts and education, and enforcement efforts. Nothing in this Agreement limits the Forest Service's authority to close or open the routes subject to interim closures through the Subpart B travel management decision(s).

a. Within 12 months of the entry of this Agreement and Order, the Forest Service will publish MVUMs that do not identify as open to public motorized vehicle use those routes listed in Paragraph 1 of Exhibit B, attached to this Agreement and Order. The routes listed in Paragraph 1 of Exhibit B have already been closed to public motorized use pursuant to a decision analyzed under NEPA.

b. Within 12 months of the entry of this Agreement and Order, the Forest Service will implement interim closures pursuant to 36 C.F.R. Part 261 of the routes or route segments listed in Paragraph 2 of Exhibit B. The routes or route segments listed in Paragraph 2 of Exhibit B are located within ESA critical habitat for the Mexican spotted owl or the Preble's meadow jumping mouse. The Forest Service will publish MVUMs that do not identify the seven routes or route segments listed in Paragraph 2 of Exhibit B as open to motorized vehicle use within 12 months of the entry of this Agreement and Order. The seven routes or route segments will remain closed and removed from the MVUMs until the Forest Service's final route designation decision on the status of the routes at the completion of the Subpart B travel management designation process described in Paragraph 3 below.

c. The Forest Service has determined that the 13 routes or route segments listed in Paragraph 3 of Exhibit B warrant interim closure restricting all public motorized vehicle

use, pursuant to 36 C.F.R. Part 261, pending issuance of the Subpart B travel management designation decision(s) identified in Paragraph 1. The routes or route segments listed in Paragraph 3 of Exhibit B are located in areas designated under the Forest Plan as 3A semi-primitive, non-motorized recreation emphasis areas of the Forest. The Forest Service will close these routes and publish MVUMs reflecting such closures within 12 months of entry of this Agreement and Order. The routes or route segments closed under Paragraph 2(c) will remain closed and removed from the MVUMs until the Forest Service's final route designation decision at the completion of the Subpart B travel management designation process described in Paragraph 1or until issuance of a project-level travel management decision involving the route(s) as described in Paragraph 3 below.

d. Within 3 months of the entry of this Agreement and Order, the Forest Service will use its best efforts to confer with Colorado Parks and Wildlife to identify any seasonal closures that would be appropriate on the 137 routes or route segments listed in Paragraph 4 of Exhibit B. The routes or route segments listed in Paragraph 4 of Exhibit B are located in areas designated under the Forest Plan as 5B Big Game Winter Range Areas. Within 45 days after the completion of conference(s) with Colorado Parks and Wildlife, the Forest Service will inform Plaintiff's counsel, as listed below, that the conference(s) have occurred. Any non-privileged written records generated in connection with the Forest Service's conference with Colorado Parks and Wildlife shall be included within the administrative record for the Subpart B travel management decision-making process described in Paragraph 1. For any routes or route segments located within 5B Big Game Winter Range Areas for which the Forest Service determines seasonal closure is warranted, the Forest Service will use its best efforts to implement the closures pursuant to 36 C.F.R. Part 261 within 12 months of entry of this Agreement and Order. Any closures deemed appropriate by the Forest Service will remain effective until the Forest Service's final route designation decision on the status of the routes at the completion of

the Subpart B travel management decision-making process described in Paragraph 1 or until issuance of a project-level travel management decision as described in Paragraph 3 below.

3. Until issuance of the travel management route designation decision(s) identified in Paragraph 1, the Forest Service will not designate as open to motorized vehicle use additional: a) roads on the MVUMs without considering the criteria set forth in 36 C.F.R. § 212.55(a) and following the procedures set forth in the applicable Forest Service Manual (currently Chapter 7703.26) which include site-specific environmental analysis and public involvement; and b) trails and areas on the MVUMs without considering, with the objective of minimizing, the criteria set forth in 36 C.F.R. § 212.55(b) and following the procedures set forth in the applicable Forest Service Manual (currently Chapter 7703.13), which include consideration of environmental impacts. Until completion of the travel management route designation process identified in Paragraph 1, for any additional route designations including altering the class of vehicle permitted to use the route, or altering the times of year for which use is designated, the Forest Service will comply with all applicable laws, including NEPA, ESA, NFMA, and 36 C.F.R. Part 212.

4. Pending issuance of the Subpart B travel management decision(s) identified in Paragraph 1, the Forest Service agrees that any technical correction for a route depicted on the MVUMs which would result in lengthening the route by more than 0.02 miles will be subject to public notice at least 30 days prior to its addition to the MVUM. The format of such public notice will be similar to the example in Exhibit C, attached to this Agreement and Order. Pending issuance of the Subpart B travel management decision identified in Paragraph 1, the Forest Service agrees to publicly post INFRA reports that show route data, along with changes (including changes to the route's spatial alignment as depicted on the MVUM in the format of ESRA shapefiles or their equivalent) and the justifications for those changes. These reports or their equivalent will be posted annually each January. Additionally, within a reasonable period

after entry of this Agreement and Order, the Forest Service will re-circulate relevant agency policy and guidance (including the agency's "Motor Vehicle Use Production Guide") on MVUM alterations or corrections to all six ranger districts within the Pike and San Isabel National Forests.

5. Until issuance of final route designation decision(s) identified in Paragraph 1, or changes made pursuant to Paragraphs 2 through 4, motorized travel not in conformity with the most recent MVUMs will be prohibited. 36 C.F.R. § 261.13.

6. Plaintiffs agree that the Court may enter the accompanying proposed order dismissing this case with prejudice.

7. The terms of this Agreement shall become effective upon entry of an Order by the Court approving this Agreement. The Parties agree that the Court retains jurisdiction over this matter solely to enforce the terms of this Settlement Agreement, modify its terms as described in Paragraph 8, or resolve any disputes concerning its implementation, until the Forest Service satisfies its obligations under the Agreement. <u>See Kokkonen v. Guardian Life Ins. Co.</u>, 511 U.S. 375 (1994).

8. This Agreement may be modified by the Court upon good cause shown by (i) written stipulation between the Parties filed with and approved by the Court, or (ii) upon written motion filed by one of the Parties and granted by the Court. In the event that either Party seeks to modify the terms of this Agreement, including the deadlines specified in Paragraphs 1 and 2, or in the event of a disagreement between the Parties concerning any aspect of this Agreement, or in the event that either Party believes that the other Party has failed to comply with any term or condition of this Agreement, the Party seeking the modification, raising the dispute, or seeking enforcement shall provide the other Party with notice of the claim. The Parties agree that they will meet and confer (telephonically or in-person) at the earliest possible time in a goodfaith effort to resolve the claim before seeking relief from the Court. If the Parties are unable to

resolve the claim themselves, either Party may seek relief from the Court. In the event that Plaintiffs believe Defendants have failed to comply with a term of this Agreement and have not sought to modify it, Plaintiffs' first remedy shall be a motion to enforce the terms of this Agreement. This Agreement shall not, in the first instance, be enforceable through a proceeding for contempt of Court.

9. The Parties agree that Paragraph 7 does not extend the Court's jurisdiction to hear any dispute over the adequacy or content of the travel management designation(s) prepared under Paragraph 1 or over the interim closure decisions identified under Paragraph 2, including the accompanying analysis or analyses under NEPA and consultation or consultations under ESA. The Parties agree that any challenge to the travel management designations discussed in Paragraph 1, the interim closure decisions identified under Paragraph 2, the designations identified under Paragraph 3, and any technical corrections to the MVUMs as identified under Paragraph 4 must be brought though a new judicial action and/or any applicable agency objection process. In entering this Agreement, neither party waives any argument it may have challenging or defending the travel management designations identified under Paragraph 3, or any technical corrections to the MVUMs as identified under

10. The Forest Service agrees to pay to Plaintiffs the sum of \$151,064.14 in full satisfaction of any and all claims for attorneys' fees, costs, and other expenses related to this action.

11. The Forest Service's payment, as identified in Paragraph 10 above, shall be accomplished by electronic fund transfer(s) to Earthjustice. The Forest Service agrees to submit all necessary paperwork to facilitate the funds transfer to the appropriate offices of the federal government within fifteen (15) business days after the Court enters this Settlement Agreement or the Plaintiffs provide all necessary information to process such paperwork, whichever date

occurs later. Plaintiffs' attorneys shall provide to the undersigned counsel for the Forest Service the appropriate account number or other information needed to facilitate payment.

12. Plaintiffs and their attorneys agree to hold harmless Defendants in any litigation, further suit, or claim arising from the payment of the agreed-upon \$151,064.14 settlement amount pursuant to Paragraph 10. Under 31 U.S.C. §§ 3711, 3716; 26 U.S.C. § 6402(d); 31 C.F.R. §§ 285.5, 901.3; and other authorities, the United States will offset against the attorney fee award Plaintiffs' delinquent debts to the United States, if any. *See Astrue v. Ratliff*, 560 U.S. 586 (2010).

13. Except as set forth in this Agreement, the Parties retain all rights, claims, defenses, and discretion they may otherwise have. Except as expressly provided in this Agreement, nothing herein shall be construed to limit or modify any discretion accorded the Forest Service by statute, regulation or by general principles of administrative law.

14. No provisions of this Agreement shall be interpreted as or constitute a commitment or requirement that the Forest Service obligate funds in contravention of the Anti-Deficiency Act, 31 U.S.C. § 1341, or any other applicable law or regulation.

15. This Agreement does not represent an admission by any party to any fact, claim, or defense in any issue in this lawsuit. This Agreement has no precedential value and shall not be cited in any other litigation or administrative proceeding except as necessary to enforce the terms of the Agreement.

16. Nothing in the terms of this Agreement shall be construed to limit or deny the power of a federal official to promulgate or amend regulations.

17. The undersigned representative of each Party certifies that he or she is fully authorized by the Party he or she represents to bind that Party to the terms of this Agreement.

18 The provisions of this Agreement shall terminate upon the Forest Service's issuance of the final route designation decision(s) identified in Paragraph 1.

Thank you for your letter of December 27, 2010, and welcome to your new position as Forest Supervisor. I appreciate receiving the statement of your staff and counsel's positions in response to our Notice of Intent to Sue letter, but unfortunately it is clear we continue to disagree on the major points of law relating to some of the routes opened by the Motor Vehicle Use Maps for the Pike and San Isabel National Forests (PSI).

Please find attached a list of specific routes comprising the over 500 miles of unauthorized and unanalyzed routes in the PSI, marked by Ranger District and route number. While my clients are happy to resend this list, please note that it is virtually the same list my clients have provided to Forest Service staff over the past year and a half in furtherance of past requests and meetings. While this is the most current list of routes, it is not necessarily a definitive list, and does not imply that all routes not included on the list have gone through the required analyses. Please let me know if you have any questions about these routes, or would like to discuss these issues further. I wish you the best of luck in your new position and look forward to working with you in the future.


