



Dear Commissioners,

I urge you to reject any proposal that would allow the discharge of toxic oil and gas waste into New Mexico's rivers, streams, or farmland.

Oil and gas operations already produce more than 100 billion gallons of waste every year in the state. This waste contains hazardous chemicals, PFAS, and even radioactive materials. No amount of rebranding or industry spin can make it safe for New Mexico's water, food, or communities.

Concentrating this waste stream doesn't solve the problem — it exacerbates it. Consolidating poisons guarantees future contaminated rivers, poisoned farmland, and sickened families.

New Mexicans are all too familiar with this story. From the Manhattan Project and Trinity Site downwinders in the Tularosa Basin to the Church Rock uranium mine spill, New Mexico's communities have already paid the price for being treated as expendable in the name of national experiments.

New Mexico is not a dumping ground or a test site for reckless industry schemes.

The people of New Mexico deserve clean water and healthy land — not endless pollution from fossil fuel companies. Right now, toxic oil and gas waste is spilling every seven hours in the state. Please protect rivers, farms, and families by saying NO to the discharge of oil and gas waste.
